Our program is designed for professionals who hold a master's degree in counseling, or a closely related field, and want to pursue further education and/or become school psychologists.

Licensure

In New Hampshire, school psychologists are licensed by the Bureau of Credentialing under the banner of the Department of Education. School psychology is considered an educational specialist licensure. Licensure as a school psychologist does not allow for private practice. As a graduate, you may wish to apply for national certification. The Nationally Certified School Psychologist (NCSP) qualification is granted by the National School Psychology Certification Board.
