Working with faculty mentors, you can collect and analyze data and interpret results to increase your knowledge and build your skill sets.

Mental Health and Addiction Studies Track

Select the Mental Health and Addiction Studies Track and help improve the quality of life of those living with mental illness, substance misuse, or addiction. Students in this track have the opportunity to apply for the year-long internship at a local mental health center during their junior year. Accepted students will work an average of 20 hours per week, earn \$20 per hour, and receive 12 college credits during their senior year.
